

Winter Course Improvement work 2020

Hole's 5 & 7

Working with Clyde Johnson we continue to move towards restoring the course with it's original features as to Mackenzies's design. This year under Clyde's advise and supervision we wish to reinstate the two bunkers into the mounds left and back left of the green. We also wish to reinstate the cross bunker on hole seven as well as the small aesthetically pleasing bunker back right. Clyde's sketches of these can be found along with this letter as well as the historic photograph's dating 1910 & 1926. Please note the works we wish to carry out have been highlighted in green the other points in purple are things to possibly consider in the future.

Hole 10

The two images below are something we discussed with Adam Newton (R&A consultant) and also tie in with things discussed with Murray Long (current club consultant). The thought was to remove the trees on the right going down the hill on hole 10 as well as the gorse to create a more open feel this would be the first step towards trying to bring the heathland characteristics to the 10th green, 11th tee area, which currently has a very parkland feel to it.
